Male nightingales advertise their skills as fathers through song.

If you know anything about nightingales, it's probably that they sing. Written about by the likes of ancient Greek playwright Aristophanes and English poet John Keats, they've also inspired such composers as Beethoven and Stravinsky to pay homage to their melancholy warbling. But not all of their songs are mournful: In fact, male nightingales use some of them to advertise their skills as fathers. One of the many factors female nightingales consider when assessing prospective mates is their suitors' paternal potential, and a 2015 study on the subject showed that better male nightingale singers are known to feed their children more often than their less-talented peers. "Better" here means singing in a more orderly fashion — repeating the same song types over and over — and varying their song choices, with plenty of buzzes, trills, and whistles.

Whereas it was previously thought that the size of a male's repertoire was the sole criterion a female considered, in nightingales, the *kind* of song is crucial as well. Overall, male nightingales are known to be doting fathers — they visit their chicks' nest as many as 16 times every hour, which is about as often as their mothers do.

Mahjongg:



We had one significant snow fall and Brookhaven Irrigation who is our snow vendor did a fabulous job of clearing courtyards and walkways...Whatever areas they missed they came back to redo the shoveling. We are lucky to have them as our snow removal company. Keep in mind that they only plow for 2+ inches of snow. The second snowfall was less than 2" and ice melt was put in the street and calcium chloride on our walkways. We advise that every homeowner should keep ice melting on hand to de-ice their own patios and walkways if needed.

HOMEOWNERS INFORMATION SHEETS

A couple of weeks ago the court captains handed out the new homeowner's information and emergency sheets. If you have not filled it out completely, we will be asking you to fill in the missing items. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

HOMEOWNERS HO3 POLICY INSURANCE

Linda Bily, our Board secretary, does an outstanding job. She follows up on all the policies to make sure you are adequately insured in case of an unforeseen disaster. Each home should be insured for no less than \$300,000. It would be good to have a policy for \$350,000 as the homes here on average sell for \$450,000. You need \$1,000,000 liability coverage along with listing Country Village Estates, 250 Theodore Drive, Coram, NY 11727 as an interesting party. Remember we are not condos; we are townhomes, and these policies should be an HO3 policy.

POOL NEWS

You will all be happy to know new pool furniture has been ordered and by the time you read this, it will have been delivered. We have a pool committee who diligently searched to find the right tables, chairs, umbrellas, umbrella stands and loungers. They were able to keep costs within our budget. All the furniture will match and is very durable, comfortable and has a 3 yr Warranty. We wish to extend our thanks to these ladies, Nancy Fritz, Sandy Bakofen and Jackie Bromberg for giving of their time and talent in choosing some great furniture.

DYMOND INDUSTRIES AND THE NEW HOMES

Below is a message I received from the engineers that have been working on getting all the approvals to START building the fourteen new homes on the 3.9 acres of land we have bordering Mooney Pond Road.

"We are extremely close to finalizing the county approval. Suffolk county department of public works is just finishing their review. After that there is some additional appraisals and bonds that need to get drawn up by the attorneys, but we should have county approval in another month or two.

Town approvals will likely follow behind that, but we are really pushing to obtain all approvals to break ground as soon as possible. It will be likely still will be a few months. Once we receive the final site plan approval, the building department approvals will go much faster."

NEW KEYPAD DOOR LOCKS AT THE POOL

This past month we had our security company install keypad entry locks at the pool doors which lead out to the pool from the clubhouse.

The back door by the bathroom has the normal push bar to get out to the pool area. To access the pool from the double glass doors next to the billiard room you must press the lighted release button on the wall to the left and the push bar at the same time, to give you access to the pool.

The code to get into the building is 0250# at both the double glass doors and by the bathrooms. Thanks to Charlie Buscaglia and Ed Tomaiuoli for their follow up to make sure this ran smoothly.

LIGHTING

The FRC (finance committee) is working with the Board to have brighter Street lights and to test out using some solar lights in different areas. We realize some walkways and some areas in the back of homes are very dark, so we are testing the use of solar light for Walkways and Courtyards. Thanks to Gene Flynn for investigating all of the lights to be used, contacting Net Zero who will provide PSEG rebate and Greg Gasiewski for following up on all of this. Hoping to have these new lights installed in the next month.

I'm sure that most of you were aware that some streetlights had been out for a few weeks. This happened because when Country Village was first built in the early 1990's they put wires underground without using conduits, which are protective tubing for the wires. After time the exterior coating of the wire broke down and the wires shorted out the flow of electricity. The poles that were out, were the ones just before the tennis court to the poles outside the pool parking lot. After much research our electricians along with the drainage crew, that we use, were able to repair this permanently. We would like to thank Mike Ellis for all his input and hard work to make sure this operation worked smoothly and correctly.

POWER WASHING OF HOMES

We have signed a contract with Absolute Cleaning Co. to have all the home power washed sometime in September.


SHREDDING EVENT



SOMEONE IN THIS COMMUNITY IS LEAVING THEIR DOG'S POOP AROUND THEODORE DRIVE, IT'S SMALL POOP, JUST TO BE CLEAR.

I guess I'll have to keep posting the Dog Rules and Regulations. **You**, your guests or caretakers are responsible for picking up the dog(s) poop. **NO EXCUSES**.

If you need poop bags, I would be happy to give you a roll.

We want to keep CVE clean, look nice, and not see your dog's poop all over.

Others and I are picking up after you. I have picked up poop in front of Unit 01, 02, 15, 81, & 175. **IT IS IRRESPONSIBLE**.



DOG RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Picking Up After Your Dogs:

There are some residents or guests not picking up after their dog. We are finding huge loads of poop and of course smaller loads.

It is disrespectful to the entire community and their guests. How would you feel if someone tracked dog poop into your home. I think you would not like it. How difficult is it to pick up your dog poop. There is *NO EXCUSE*, it is just irresponsible and lazy.



DOG RULES AND REGULATIONS

2. When dog(s) urinates pour water over spot:

Dog owners must carry a *bottle* of water to pour over their dog's urine, not spraying. It really does not matter if it is a female or male dog, female dogs have more of nitrogen. Female dogs urinate in a specific spot which makes it more concentrated, and males lift their leg and it's sprayed (exception to rule for males as pups they urinate like a female and also when they get much older)

Right after your dog goes to the bathroom, water that spot thoroughly to flush nitrogen and salts from the soil. Do not be stingy with the water. You want to use about twice as much water as there is urine to dilute the nitrogen content sufficiently.

3. Letting dogs roam free on common property.

No dogs should be running free on the common property, it is a safety hazard to your neighbors. This is a fifty-five and older community with rules and regulations. When you moved into this community you received the booklet with the rules, it would have been great if you read it, I am sure if you felt you could not abide by the rules you would not have purchased a home here.

4. Brookhaven does have a leash law.

Town of Brookhaven 2024-02-22 The Code Chapter 23 Dog Control and Animal Welfare§ 23-1 Declaration of legislative findings and intent.[Amended 4-17-2001 by L.L. No. 9-2001, effective 4-20-2001] It is hereby declared and found that the health, welfare and safety of the inhabitants of the Town of Brookhaven require regulations supplementing and superseding Articles 7 and 26 of the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law and pertaining to the licensure, seizure and disposition of privately owned dogs and cats and the humane treatment

of animals. Articles 7 and 26 of the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law are incorporated by reference herein. The Town Board of the Town of Brookhaven has determined that the running at large and other uncontrollable

behavior of dogs have caused physical harm to persons and damage to property and have created nuisances within the Town. It is the intent of the Town Board in the enactment.

It is the intent of the Town Board in the enactment of this chapter, to protect the health, safety and well-being of persons and property by imposing restrictions on persons owning or possessing dogs within the Town.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

AT Large Off the premises of the owner and not under the control of the owner, his agent, or a member of his family, whether by rope, leash or similar device

Dog on leash laws are laws that require dogs to be restrained by a leash or a similar device when they are outside of an enclosed area. These laws vary by state and locality, and some states may not have any leash laws at all. The purpose of these laws is to prevent dog-related incidents, such as bites or attacks. Dog owners should check the local dog leash laws before taking their dogs to public places.

10 Useful Aspirin Tricks You Should Know [News](#) March 22, 2025

Aspirin has a lot of unexpected everyday applications in addition to being a pain reliever. These ten useful aspirin tips can be useful in a variety of circumstances.

1. Reduces Insect Bites' Itching

Aspirin aids in reducing insect bite-related irritation and itching.
One aspirin tablet should be crushed and dissolved in water.
For immediate relief, apply the solution on the bite.

2. Brightens Dark Armpits

In a cup of warm water, crush two aspirin tablets and dissolve them.
After applying the mixture, let it sit on your underarms for an hour.
Use water to rinse well.
Continue every day until the intended outcomes are obtained.

3. Gets Rid of Dandruff

Add two crushed aspirin tablets to your shampoo.
In order to properly eradicate dandruff, wash your hair as usual.

4. Addresses Acne

Because of its anti-inflammatory qualities, aspirin can lessen acne.
One aspirin tablet should be crushed and combined with a few drops of water.
Before going to bed, apply to the afflicted area and let it sit overnight.
If your skin is irritated, do not use.

5. Cleans Clothes of Sweat Stains

Add a cup of warm water to two crushed aspirin tablets.
After applying the mixture on perspiration stains, let it sit overnight.
As usual, wash.

6. Removes and Softens Calluses

Add a teaspoon of lemon juice to seven crushed aspirin tablets.
Cover with a plastic bag, wrap your feet in a warm towel, and apply to callused regions.
After ten minutes, use a pumice stone to scrub.

7. Softer Skin with a Face Mask

Aspirin aids in skin cleansing and softening.
Combine two tablespoons of yogurt with five crushed aspirin tablets.
After applying to your face, wait 20 minutes.
After a thorough rinse, use a moisturizer.

For noticeable effects, use this mask for two weeks.

8. Gets Rid of Bathroom Soap Scum

Five aspirin tablets should be crushed and used with liquid detergent.

After spraying the afflicted area, wait half an hour

Use a moist cloth to clean.

9. Restores Shine to Hair

Aspirin can help restore the volume and luster that hair may have lost over time.

Add a cup of water to eight crushed aspirin tablets.


Put on hair, let it sit for fifteen minutes, and then give it a good rinse.

10. Extends the Life of Fresh Flowers


Add one crushed aspirin pill to a vase of water.
